






Provide Advanced First Aid – (HLTAID014)

About This Course

The Provide Advanced First Aid (HLTAID014) course includes a greater number of medical conditions and illnesses than those covered in the basic Provide First Aid (HLTAID011) course.

This advanced course also teaches the latest thinking in applying first aid to more-complex conditions such as allergic reactions, anaphylaxis, emergency childbirth, crush injuries, major trauma management, the use of spinal boards and stretchers, the misuse of substances including alcohol and illicit drugs, handling emotionally disturbed casualties, exposure to extreme temperatures, the use of tourniquets and more.



It provides the skills and knowledge required to deliver advanced first aid to a casualty in line with first aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national clinical bodies.

The course is suitable to all persons who may be required to provide advanced first aid services in a range of situations, including workplaces, community settings and high-risk environments.

Specific licensing and regulatory requirements relating to this competency, including requirements for refresher training, should be obtained from the relevant national/state/territory Work Health and Safety Regulatory Authorities.

This is a two-day course.

Training Standards

Qualifications

Upon successful completion of the Provide Advanced First Aid course, Public Safety Training & Response Group will issue participants with a Statement of Attainment under the Australian Qualifications Framework for the following accredited units:

The course incorporates the following accredited units:

- HLTAID009 Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation
- HLTAID010 Provide Basic Emergency Life Support
- HLTAID011 Provide First Aid

Participant Requirements

Participants require a Unique Student Identifier (USI), a number required under government legislation for anyone undertaking accredited Vocational Education and Training (VET). Obtaining a USI is free. To apply for a USI, visit: https://www.usi.gov.au/

Participants require general literacy and numeracy skills, and a moderate level of fitness.

Physical tasks involve performing at least two minutes of CPR (five cycles of chest compressions and breaths) on an adult resuscitation mannequin placed on the floor and perform at least two minutes of CPR (five cycles of chest compressions and breaths) on an infant resuscitation mannequin placed on a firm surface.

Participants at face-to-face learning should wear in comfortable clothing, nothing too loose, long pants and enclosed shoes.

For online learning, internet and computer access is required, along with general computer skills. The computer must be able to play audio.

Where applicable, participants must have completed any required pre-course online learning and assessment prior to attending face-to-face training.

Participants must be aged 14 or over. Participants aged 14–17 require written consent from a parent or legal guardian.

If a participant is suffering any transmittable illness (flu, common cold, Covid, etc), please do not attend the training to avoid impacting other participants.



Course Formats

Full Course: The full course is required for those who don't hold a current Statement of Attainment (i.e. They have never completed the accredited course, or it has been more than three years since completing the course and their qualifications have lapsed).

Refresher Course: This is available for those who have a current Statement of Attainment that is less than three years old and near expiry.

Course Delivery

Courses are predominantly delivered on a face-to-face basis at our training rooms at Oxley, south-west Brisbane, which can cater for up to 30 participants.



Where applicable, there may be some prereading and learning required, or units of online learning. Learner guides are provided.

By prearrangement, training can be conducted offsite at your business premises, educational facility, community hall, or government office. Please contact us to discuss.

This course is available in two delivery modes:

- 1) 8 12 hours of pre-course study online theory and 1 full day of face-to-face practical.
- 2) 2 days face-to-face, including theory and practical.

Assessment

The course includes assessments of practical skills and a written questionnaire.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is not offered for this course due to the need to learn up-to-date methodologies and demonstrate competencies to ensure high-level upskilling.

Course Outcomes

The Provide Advanced First Aid (HLTAID014) course teaches a wide range of instruction on providing First Aid to a greater number of medical conditions and illnesses.

Each candidate will demonstrate skills in an environment that provides realistic indepth, scenarios and simulations to assess candidates' skills and knowledge.

Course outcomes include:

- All requirements consistent with prerequisite qualifications (HLTAID011 – Provide First Aid, HLTAID009 – Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, HLTAID010 – Provide Basic Emergency Life Support).
- Guidelines and procedures including:
 - potential incident hazards and risk minimisation



- processes when providing first aid
- infection control procedures, including use of standard precautions and resuscitation barrier devices
- requirements for currency of skill and knowledge
- o first aid codes of practice
- appropriate workplace or site procedures relevant to the provision of first aid
- o contents of first aid kits
- Legal, workplace and community considerations, including:
 - o duty of care requirements
 - own skills and limitations
 - consent and how it relates to the conscious and unconscious casualty
 - privacy and confidentiality requirements
 - awareness of potential need for stress management techniques and available support for rescuers
- In relation to the administration of medication
 - o legal requirements
 - o the five rights
 - the responsibilities of the first aider
- Considerations when providing CPR, including:
 - upper airway and effect of positional change
 - appropriate duration and cessation of CPR
 - appropriate use of an AED
 - safety and maintenance procedures for an AED
 - o chain of survival
 - how to access emergency services

- Techniques for providing CPR to adults, children and infants including:
 - how to recognise that a casualty is unconscious and not breathing normally
 - rate, ratio and depth of compressions and ventilations
 - correct hand positioning for compressions
 - basic anatomy, physiology and the differences between adults, children and infants relating to CPR
- Considerations when providing first aid, including:
 - assessment,
 interpretation and
 documentation of vital
 signs, including normal
 clinical values for
 respirations, temperature,
 pulse and level of
 consciousness
 - how to conduct a secondary assessment of a casualty
 - basic triage processes
 - procedures for dealing with casualties who are aged or infirm
 - procedures for first aid management when dealing with major and minor accidents in the workplace or site
 - procedures when providing first aid to children
 - use of ancillary first aid equipment
 - o co-ordination of resources
 - o contents of first aid kits



- Signs, symptoms and management of the following conditions or injuries:
 - abdominal injuries
 - allergic reaction
 - anaphylaxis
 - o asthma
 - non-life-threatening bleeding
 - life-threatening bleeding including use of tourniquets and haemostatic dressings
 - o burns
 - cardiac conditions, including chest pain
 - childbirth
 - choking
 - crush injuries
 - o diabetes
 - drowning
 - ear injuries and bleeding from the ear
 - envenomation all current treatments
 - o eye injuries
 - fractures, dislocations, strains and sprains
 - head, neck and spinal injuries
 - o hypothermia
 - o hyperthermia
 - o minor wounds
 - nosebleed
 - poisoning
 - seizures
 - shock
 - sharps injuries
 - stroke
- substance misuse, including prescription and illicit drugs and alcohol
- psychological impacts of first aid incidents on rescuers and how to seek help.


